Since coming back from the half-term holiday, I've been spending a lot of my time showing prospective parents around the school in readiness for their children starting school next September.

I have really enjoyed these as it has given me the opportunity to showcase our school and what makes it unique in comparison to other schools in Canterbury and further afield. It is all too easy to think that what we have here at Bridge is 'normal' but, as I walk around, it is evident how much goes on within the school and the efforts that the staff make to ensure that the children of Bridge & Patricxbourne CEP School get the very best.

A particular case in point was the support we gained for our annual fireworks event last week. So many of our parents and staff supported either in the morning, in the evening or clearing up the next morning. The money raised from this event will cover 50% of the costs of our school minibuses, which the children benefit enormously from. We've had these minibuses for just under a year now and already I have staff telling me that they can't imagine the school without them.

Prospective parents have also been very impressed with the quality of Art and Music evident throughout the school – this is a real strength and something that I am very keen to continue developing. Our sport provision is also a draw to many parents. We have great links with Bridge Tennis Club through Stewart Bristow and both Mr Perfect and Mrs Pearson do an amazing job of encouraging children into Sport & PE – both in the class and in wider opportunities.

As we walk around, parents usually comment upon the behaviour and conduct of the pupils, which is exemplary and I always ascribe this to the relationships that exist between staff, parents and pupils.

I always finish the school tour in the library. When I first interviewed for this job 18 months ago, it was the library that I highlighted as something I would really like to develop and I'm very pleased with everything we have achieved so far and we're not done yet...!
